Happy Spring to all! While we may have been on a weather roller coaster this past winter and early spring, I think its safe to say the best is ahead of us weather wise. Once again, our Babylon Village maintenance, sanitation and DPW crews worked throughout the winter ensuring our roadways, sidewalks and municipal parking lots were as safe and accessible as possible. Kudos for their diligence and effort. The welcome sights of spring and summer abound. The E. Donald Conroy Golf Course is in excellent condition and opened for play March 31st and the Village Pool is in better shape than ever, opening for the season on June 22nd.

Our annual Little League Parade kicked off baseball season on April 14th with players marching in balmy 60 degree plus weather. Our playing fields are in terrific shape, thanks to the combined efforts of Skip Gardner, our Village Highway Crew and many dedicated volunteers. Thanks also to our little league volunteers for laying down the clay and sod. Stroll down one afternoon and catch some of the action. It's quintessential small-town living at its best.

The Village celebrated Earth Day a bit early with April 21st cleanups occurring at several sites that help improve our local waterways. Thanks go to the Save the Great South Bay organization for organizing the cleanups.

Ongoing improvement projects continue throughout our Village, with more scheduled to start shortly. Our Greenhouse is in "full bloom" with over 12,000 plantings scheduled throughout the Village for everyone to enjoy. Brackets for the flowering baskets have been newly painted and the September 11th Memorial Garden will feature some new plantings, as well as additional updates to various flower beds and gardens. Special thanks to our "Greenhouse Ladies" for all their hard work. Their enthusiasm and efforts help keep Babylon Village a beautiful place to live.

Skip Gardner and his crew have been rebuilding drains on many Village roadways and drainage improvements and paving on Locust Avenue from Route 109 to Livingston Avenue has been completed. In addition, new Smart Sponge boxes continue to be installed throughout the Village to aid pre-treatment of rain water. Resurfacing and drainage improvements are planned from N. Carll Avenue to Depot Place.

Our Village is one of Long Island's most picturesque and I urge all our residents to enjoy its beauty and many activities. We've worked hard through the years to create a pedestrian-friendly, safe and walkable community for residents and visitors. Take a stroll through our vibrant downtown, visit the Sunday Farmer's Market beginning June 3rd, shop locally and enjoy the numerous entertainment and recreation opportunities Babylon offers. Come down Friday nights and enjoy the Summer Concert Series at the Village Gazebo, spruced up with new paint and flooring. I'm excited to announce that the Argyle Theatre opened its doors on April 21st after much anticipation. This Main Street venue will provide entertain for residents and visitors alike and is a welcome addition to our diverse and thriving downtown.

Please stop by the upcoming Coffee and Conversation with the Mayor on **May 5th**. I am always eager to speak with Village residents and listen to any concerns, ideas or insights regarding Babylon Village.

Babylon Village has just had its 5th migration of Alewives since 1889. The Alwive is a fish of integral importance to the Great South Bay's delicate ecosystem. We are working to live stream the cameras that have been placed at the Alewife ladder (just west of the waterfall at Argyle Lake) so that students and other interested Suffolk County viewers can witness the migration of the Alewives. This migration is another exciting sign that many of the Village's environmental protection programs are succeeding and thriving


#### **2018 TAX RATE**

Mayor Ralph Scordino reports the Village Board of Trustees will not increase the tax rate for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 2018. Tax bills will be mailed on or about May 11th. If you do not receive your bill and your mortgage company does not escrow for payment, call The Tax Receiver's office at 631-669-1500. If you recently purchased property, call the Tax Receiver's office as it takes a few months once the deed is recorded to receive the change of ownership from the County Clerk's office. Taxes are due June 1, 2018. Check the legal notice in THE BEACON or visit our website in May for a more detailed explanation.

#### **NEWS FROM THE VILLAGE CLERK'S OFFICE**

<u>Landscapers</u>: All landscapers working in Babylon Village must obtain a permit ANNUALLY to ensure they are aware of Village rules and regulations. Applications are available at the Village Clerk's office and on our website. *Possession of a permit is NOT a recommendation by the Village as to the quality of the work a landscaper will perform.* 

It is the responsibility of property owners to make sure any contractors hired are properly insured. It is suggested you obtain a certificate of insurance showing coverage.



#### **BUILDING DEPARTMENT NEWS**

The Building Department reminds all Village residents of the following important regulations:

- Boat storage is not permitted on residential property after April 1st.
- Self-locking gates and alarms are now mandatory for all pools in the Village of Babylon.
- Pumping swimming pool water into streets or street drains is prohibited.
- All new and altered driveways require Planning Board approval.

#### **SANITATION DEPARTMENT NEWS**



Please help us better serve you by noting the regulations below. If you have questions about these issues, please call the Village Sanitation Department at 631-669-4878.

<u>Yard Waste</u> (*leaves*, *plant clippings*, - *anything that grows*) should be separated from all other rubbish and placed in a clear plastic bag for a separate pick-up on your regular rubbish day. This is mandated from Babylon Town, which runs the landfills we use. There can be no plastic pots, plant tags or other non-green contaminates in yard waste bags or the bags will not be accepted and left at the curb.

<u>Metal Objects</u> When putting out metal objects for pick-up *you must* call ahead to advise the Sanitation Department that your item(s) will be out. These include refrigerators, washers, dryers, treadmills and BBQ grills.

Place your rubbish between the sidewalk and the curb not earlier than 6 p.m. the evening before nor later than 7a.m. the morning of collection day, and remove empty containers from the curb. *There is no garbage collection or recycling of any kind on weekends and holidays*. When rubbish or recycling collection falls on a holiday, please do no put items out for pickup until your regularly scheduled day the following week.

Residents are responsible for any debris left in the street or at the curb by their landscaping companies. Any leaves or other debris left behind, should be bagged by the resident and placed in your yard until your regular rubbish

#### S.T.O.P. AND SHRED SET FOR SEPTEMBER 22nd

The next S.T.O.P. (Stop Throwing Out Pollutants) Day is scheduled for *September 22nd* at the Village Sanitation Department from 9 a.m. until noon. Residents may drop off acceptable household pollutants: latex and oil-based paints, car batteries, household cleaners, laundry products, used motor oil and other items. In addition to household pollutants, September 22 also offers residents the chance to protect their identity and personal information by bringing down papers and documents for secure shredding.

The Village will dispose of all STOP materials and shredded paper according to environmental codes.
